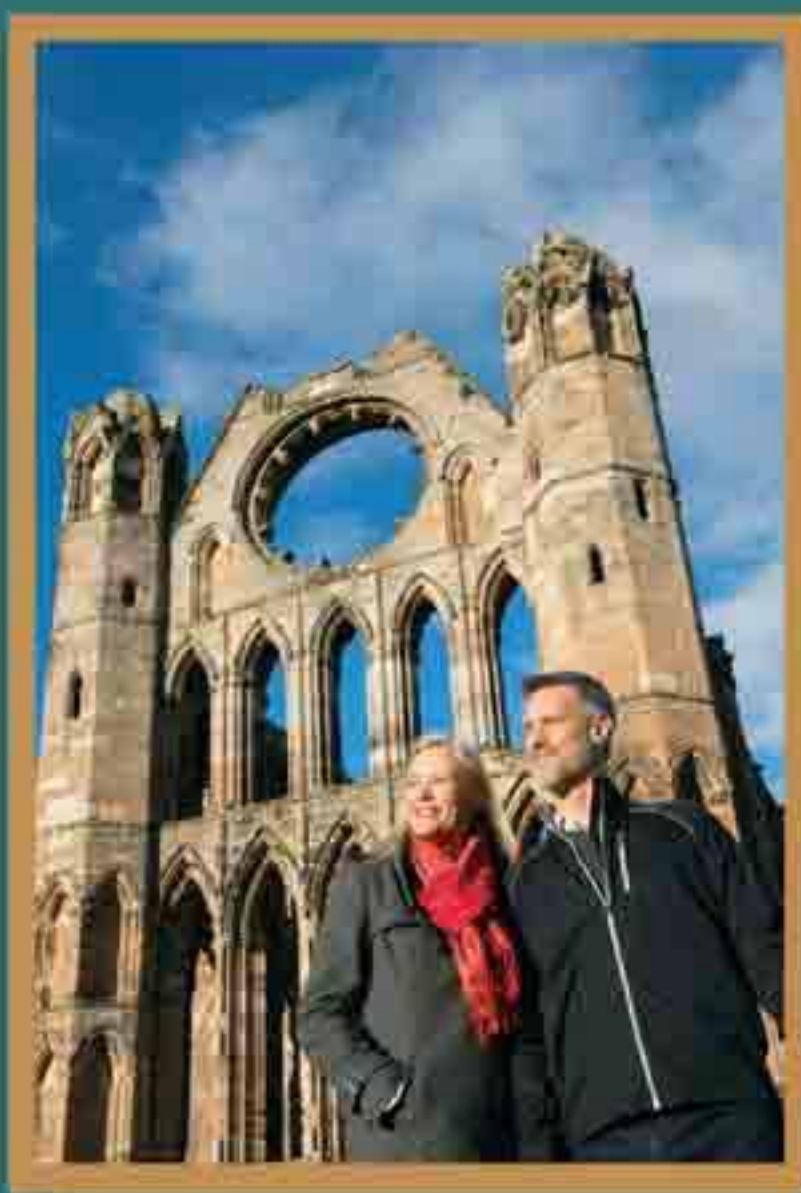




HISTORY AND CULTURE

ELGIN CATHEDRAL

Known as the 'Lantern of the North' it's a majestic, historic ruin situated in Elgin. It is one of Scotland's most beautiful medieval buildings, dating back to the 13th century and has a fascinating rich history. A shop and information point can be found at the entrance.

BRODIE CASTLE

An iconic Scottish tower house set amidst 71 hectares of peaceful parkland. Filled to the turrets with antique furniture and paintings, the legacy of generations of Clan Brodie, this 16th-century castle is a slice of Scottish history not to be missed.

DUFFUS CASTLE - FREE

Served as a fortress residence for over 500 years, from the 1100s to the 1700s. When the first castle was built, around 1150, it was among the strongest castles in Scotland. By the time of its abandonment in 1705, it was little more than a decaying fragment but still stands as a beautiful ruin. Walk around the outer moat and climb the mound to enjoy the lovely views.
