Tobacco Track & Trace System

The Association of Convenience Stores (ACS) are reminding retailers that the tobacco track and system is moving from the current IT provider De La Rue (DLR) to a new IT provider called Dentsu. The new Dentsu system will go live 1 July.

ACS state that Retailers registered on the existing track and trace system will have all their information automatically transferred to the new Dentsu system. This means that your Economic Operator Identifier Code (EOID) and Facility Identifier Code (FID) will remain the same.

Retailers will receive the below communication emails from Dentsu, to their email account registered on the current track and trace system, by the dates referred to below. **It is important that these emails are not deleted.**

1. You will have already received an email from Dentsu about your automatic registration that gives you access to a test system. The email will be from the following address no-reply@qa-uk-trackandtrace-dentsutracking.com
2. A second email from Dentsu between 20 June and 1 July that will confirm retailers' registration to the live Dentsu UK track and trace system via the following email address no-reply@uk-trackandtrace-dentsutracking.com. This email will also include log in details that will allow retailers to access and manage their account. Retailers will be given a default password that must be changed when you first log on to the new Dentsu system.

ACS advise that retailers who have deleted the email and need to retrieve their information can do so by contacting uktntsupport@dentsu.com.

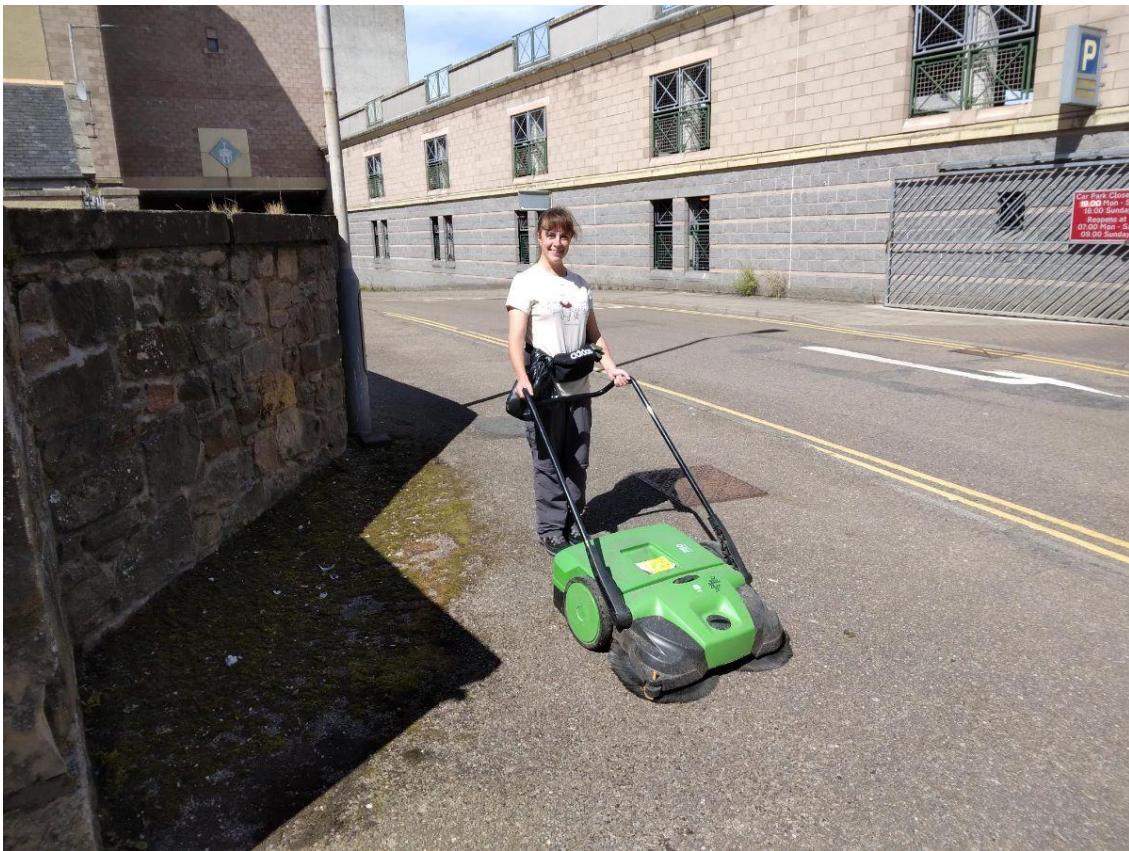
