Dedicated Street Ambassadors: Keeping Elgin Beautiful

Our Street Ambassadors, Sam and Willie, are invaluable additions to the team. Together, they have undertaken a remarkable mission to enhance the cleanliness and overall appearance of our streets, making Elgin an even more inviting place to live and visit.

A Clean Sweep: Since Sam's induction in May, they, along with Willie, have collected an impressive 120 bags of litter from our streets. This is in addition to the efforts of Moray Council's cleaning teams and the company we've hired for three mornings each week. This commitment to cleanliness is a testament to our dedication to keeping Elgin pristine.

Eliminating Eyesores: Our Street Ambassadors have also tackled the issue of unsightly fly posters on vacant property windows. Over the course of Summer 2023, they removed more than 300 such posters, restoring a sense of order and aesthetics to our town.

Weeding Out Problems: Ground-level weeds can quickly become a nuisance. Our Street Ambassadors understand this and have diligently uprooted these weeds on a weekly basis when possible, ensuring our streets remain tidy and presentable.

Enhancing Our Living Spaces: Our Street Ambassadors organized deep cleaning efforts in several closes and communal spaces. This initiative not only beautified our town but also promoted a sense of pride in our shared spaces.

Brightening Up Plainstones: In late Summer 2023, we embarked on a project to paint the lampposts and black tree benches around the Plainstones, adding a touch of vibrancy to this central hub of our community. The project will continue into 2024, ensuring that all benches receive a fresh coat of paint when stable weather conditions prevail.

Vacant Property Upkeep Support: To maintain the overall appearance of Elgin Town Centre our Street Ambassadors assist with the upkeep of vacant properties. This is through washing windows & facias, routine inspections for properties we hold keys for & reporting any security issues to landlords/property agents.

Gull Management Project: Protecting Our Urban Environment

Our ongoing commitment to maintaining a safe and clean urban environment in Elgin has extended to the Gull Management Project, which continued to deliver positive results this year.

Sonic Success: Building on the success of the first sonic device installed in 2022, we invested in another for the West End of the High Street. This additional device proved equally successful, preventing gulls from nesting in the area and contributing to a more peaceful urban environment. •Varied Approaches: Our commitment to gull management goes beyond just sound. This year, we employed diverse methods, including hawking and ground dogs, to further disrupt gulls from nesting in unwanted areas.

Taking Action: For particularly persistent gulls, we took proactive measures by removing eggs and nests from 14 businesses this came to **127 eggs being removed**. Elgin BID played a crucial role by contributing 70% of the costs for this removal, as well as handling the licensing process on behalf of businesses, saving them both time and money.

Our Gull Management Project remains an integral part of our efforts to maintain a clean and safe urban environment. With the dedication of our team and the support of our community, we will continue to address the challenges posed by urban wildlife, ensuring Elgin remains a welcoming and comfortable place for all.

Educating Our Community: Gull Awareness Through Embrace Elgin Magazine

In our ongoing commitment to fostering a harmonious living environment in Elgin, we've recognized the importance of not only managing gull populations but also educating our community on responsible practices. Our Embrace Elgin Magazine has become a platform for this important outreach.

Guiding License Application: We understand that engaging with nature, even in an urban setting, often requires proper permits and licenses. To facilitate this process, we encourage our community members to apply for licenses from NatureScot when necessary.

Addressing Anti-Social Behaviour in the Town Centre

Late Summer 2022 through late Spring 2023 presented us with a significant challenge as we observed a concerning increase in Anti-Social Behaviour within our beloved Town Centre. In response to this issue, your BID Team stepped up to the plate, demonstrating unwavering commitment to the community's safety and the prosperity of our local businesses.

Our actions were swift and strategic:

First Responders to Disruptive Youth Behaviour: When disruptive youth behaviour threatened the peace of our High Street, the BID Team became the first point of contact for affected businesses. Our dedicated team visited establishments, effectively diffusing situations and ensuring a safer environment for all. Following these incidents, we highlighted the ongoing issues to Police Scotland.
Brightening Closes: Recognizing the importance of well-lit spaces, we made improvements to lighting in Fife Arms Close, Harrow Inn Close & City Arms Close, enhancing both safety and ambiance for residents and visitors.

• **Protecting Vacant Properties:** In the early Autumn of 2022, an unfortunate spike in break-ins to vacant properties necessitated immediate action. Your BID Team sprang into action, securing properties wherever possible and promptly informing landlords of the unfolding issues.

• Quarterly Collaborations with Public Safety Agencies: In response to bin fires during Summer/Autumn, we established quarterly meetings with representatives from the Scottish Fire & Rescue and Police Scotland Business Resilience Officer. These meetings have yielded valuable insights, enabling targeted visits to businesses by the police and fire departments to reduce crime and improve safety measures.

• Anti-Social Behaviour Awareness Campaign: Our commitment to safeguarding extended to a comprehensive awareness campaign. We embarked on a letter campaign designed to educate and highlight safeguarding and lone working policies, fostering a safer and more secure environment for everyone.

• **Community Feedback and Partnership:** We value the input of our local businesses and community members. In May 2023, we conducted a survey asking businesses about their safety perceptions in the city centre. The results were anonymously shared with stakeholders, leading to a constructive meeting. Following this gathering, we are collaborating with Moray Council to enhance CCTV coverage and relocate communal seating areas away from cash machines, addressing concerns raised by our community.

We wanted to understand firsthand the strengths and weaknesses they encountered in applicants. This research was the foundation upon which we built our interactive session.

A Learning Experience Like No Other

The result? An engaging and interactive session with S4 students, poised to take their first steps beyond the school gates. Instead of merely dictating the dos and don'ts of job applications and interviews, we presented real-world challenges faced by local employers as questions to the students.

The feedback was resoundingly positive. Students expressed that they gained a deeper understanding of the job application and interview process, far beyond what traditional guidance could offer. Hearing directly from local employers about their expectations added a priceless dimension to their learning experience.
